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ABOUT HUNGER IN THE CAPITAL DISTRICT

According to Feeding America, more than 2 million children and adults in New York are food insecure. Essentially, more than 10.7% of the population of NY do not have enough food to meet basic nutritional needs.

New York State and Capital District hunger statistics (2019)

New York State

10.7% of total population = 2,090,550 people are food insecure 15.6% of children = 626,450 infants and children are food insecure

Albany County

10.4% of total population = 31,850 people are food insecure 14.9% of children = 8,460 infants and children are food insecure

Rensselaer County

10.9% of total population = 17,300 people are food insecure 16.3% of children = 5,070 infants and children are food insecure

Saratoga County

8.1% of total population = 18,400 people are food insecure 10.4% of children = 4,840 infants and children are food insecure Schenectady County

> 10.3% of total population = 16,020 people are food insecure 15.7% of children = 5,260 infants and children are food insecure

THE EFFECTS OF HUNGER ON YOUR NEIGHBORS AND THE COMMUNITY

Prolonged food insecurity can lead to a lifetime of poor health

Hungry children do not perform well in school

Hungry adults do not perform well in the workplace

Hungry senior citizens are forced to choose between medication and basic utilities and food Hungry veterans choose between food and shelter

TRUTH AND MYTH OF THE SNAP (formerly called food stamps) PROGRAM

MYTH-SNAP provides enough food to feed the hungry

TRUTH-At least 42% of the hungry in our 4 counties do not qualify for SNAP, according to Feeding America

TRUTH-SNAP benefit typically supply enough food for only 3 weeks of the month

TRUTH-Snap only provides approximately a \$4.67 per day food allowance, according to Center on Budget and Policy Priorities

TRUTH-Some people who are food insecure do not want to apply for SNAP—they just need short-term assistance or only visit a pantry to fill a gap in income

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ABOUT THE FOOD PANTRIES—QUICK FACTS

- The Food Pantries is a coalition of more than 68 food pantries
- Our service area is Albany, Rensselaer, Saratoga, and Schenectady Counties
- The Food Pantries was founded in 1979
- We collect food from food drives for free distribution to our member pantries
 - The community can help by hosting Food and Fund Drives
- \$1 can help provide 6.25 pounds of food to the hungry
- All of the services we provide to our members are completely free for them to utilize

HOW THE FOOD PANTRIES HELPS FEED THE HUNGRY IN OUR COMMUNITIES In 2022, we helped fund, collect and deliver enough food for more than 3.2 million meals and 282,033 pantry visits

Delivery Service—3,630,485 pounds of food delivered to our member pantries

Food Drives—141,969 pounds of food collected

Donated Products Delivered—206,363 pounds of donations distributed

Infant Needs— 64,230 diapers and 688 cans of formula distributed

Food Funding—Money is put on account at the food bank for our food pantries to pay for food, and we purchase milk vouchers, grocery store gift certificates and produce gift certificates.

Information and Referrals— 8,741 people were referred to pantry services and additional programs.

WHO WE SERVE THROUGH OUR MEMBER PANTRIES (2021 Numbers and Statistics)

Approximately 65,709 people access food from our member food pantries each year. On average, an individual visits a pantry approximately 5 times each year. Some use a food pantry in the event of a crisis and some need food pantries to alleviate a chronic state of food insecurity.

86,286 pantry visits by infants and children (ages 0-17) 159.054 pantry visits by adults (ages 18-59) 36,693 pantry visits by senior citizens (ages 60+)
